Member of the Spalding Society. F.S.A. Marr. at Walthamstow, co. Essex, 13 July 1734. Died s.p. 6, and bur. at Southwick 16 May, 1758, aged 51. ARMS.—Gules a chevron Or. between 3 leopards' faces Argent, crowned of the second.

CREST.—On a chapeau Azure, turned up ermine, a leopard's head couped Argent, crowned Or. Granted 27 June, 13 Chas. I. by Sir Edward Bysshe. Garter.

Martha Lynn, Lady of the Manor of Southwick, sister and sole heir of her brother George Lynn. Marr. by Lic. at Southwick 10 June 1755, then aged 37. Died 4 and bur. at Southwick 8 Feb. 1796, aged 78. M.I. Will dat. 3 Nov. 1791 and Codicil 31 Dec. 1793. Bequeaths her estates to her kinsman George Francis Johnson, whose great-grandfather Martyn Johnson married Mary, d. of John Lynn by Grace Cade his wife. ("Genealogist," p. 107.)
